	Important Buddhist O	bservances	
•	January 1st: New Year's Day (Shusho-e) — The first day of the year upon which we reflect on the past year and resolve to live an even better life.		
•	January 16th: Ho-Onko – The day on which we commemorate the memory of Shinran Shonin (May 21, 1173 - January 16, 1262), the Founder of the Jodo Shinshu (True Pure Land) sect of Buddhism.		
•	February 12 <sup>th</sup> : Nirvana Day (Nehan-e) – On this day we solemnly observe the passing of Shakyamuni Buddha into Pari-nirvana.		
•	March (18th or 19th): Spring Higan (Higan-e) – Higan (Sanskrit for "other Shore") is observed on or around the Spring Equinox. The "other shore" refers to "Enlightenment" or "Nirvana" which is attained through the Six Paramitas, Buddhist concepts every Buddhist aspires to practice in their daily lives.		
•	April 8 <sup>th</sup> Hanamatsuri (Birth of the Buddha) – On this day we celebrate the birth of Siddhartha Gautama (who became Shakyamuni Buddha upon Enlightenment). At the Hanamatsuri Service, a flower shrine ("Hanamido") is set up in front of the main alter representing Lumbini Garden, Siddhartha's birthplace. The Sangha offers flowers and pours sweet tea over a statue of the infant Buddha.		
•	May 21 <sup>st</sup> : Gotan-e / Fujimatsuri (Shinran Shonin Day) - On this day we observe his birth of Shinran Shonin, the founder of the Jodo Shinshu sect. He was born near Kyoto, Japan on May 21, 1173.		
	Mid-July to Mid-August: Obon / Hatsubon – During this time we fondly reflect upon the love and compassion our loved ones, who had passed away, shared with us, and to celebrate their lives with joy.		
•	September (20th or 21st): Fall Higan (Higan-e) — On or around the Fall equinox, we again are mindful of the Six Paramitas, which eventually lead to reaching the "other shore" (Enlightenment or Nirvana).		
•	<b>December 8th: Bodhi Day (Jodo-e)</b> – On this day we commemorate Shakyamuni Buddha's Enlightenment under the Bodhi Tree (Tree of Enlightenment) over 2500 years ago.		
•	December 31st: Joya-e (Year-end Service) — On New Year's Eve we meditate on and give thanks to the countless olessings we have received throughout the year and reflect on the teachings of the Buddha.
