






**SAN BU JŌ**

This short introductory piece is used at the beginning of many Jōdo Shinshu services. The verses were written by Zendō (Shan-tao, 613 – 681 AD) the Fifth of the Seven Masters lineage of Nembutsu thought according to Shinran. The verse comes from Zendō's commentary *Hōji-san* (*On the Right Recitation of Sūtra*), of the Amida Sūtra (Amida-kyō.)
